Further Details for Parents & Campers

A letter or email will be sent to each camper nearer the time of camp giving advice about clothes and equipment. Pictures taken during camp may be used for camp publicity purposes. If you have any objections to this, please contact the CCIW booking officer by post or e-mail. CCIW will not be responsible for loss of personal property of campers. Campers sent home for bad behaviour will not be entitled to a refund.

Transport

Transport will be available from the stations / bus stops in Tywyn / Barmouth to the respective camp sites if you let us know when you require it.

Insurance

Insurance: CCIW is insured for public liability. Public liability is a cover which provides protection for campers should they have an accident which was due to the negligence of the leaders or organisers of Christian Camps In Wales.

The camp fee does not include personal accident cover for campers, i.e. if a camper receives an injury on camp for which CCIW is not liable, there will be no entitlement to any payment from CCIW's insurers. Adventure activities are provided by Licensed Activity Providers who have their own public liability insurance cover.

Code of Conduct

We want everyone to enjoy camp as much as possible and in every way. These few rules will help to ensure this, provided they are followed.

Remember that the rules are for your safety and enjoyment. If you book to come on camp you agree to abide by this code of conduct.

1. It is expected that everyone will try to join in everything, and maintain acceptable standards of behaviour.

2. You will be expected to follow the instructions of the leaders and officers at all times, especially during adventure activities. Failure to follow instructions promptly could be dangerous to you and to others.

3. Under no circumstances are you to go into the tents of the opposite sex.
4. Damage or theft of CCIW or other camper's property will not be tolerated.

5. No alcohol, smoking, drugs etc.

6. No knives other than those used for eating are permitted on camp.

7. Phones and other electronic equipment are not necessary. They must be switched off during meal times and meetings and any other time instructed by the leaders.

Violations of the rules may result in campers being sent home.
